#### The Prince formerly known as Twankey

The cast and crew of Romeo and Juliet, are delighted to welcome Howie Watkins as Prince Escalus. Howie, of course, played the larger than life Widow Twankey in this year's Aladdin. This is his first outing with Shakespeare and despite starting several weeks after the rest of the cast, is getting into his stride as the somewhat bad tempered royal.

Rehearsals are coming along well and we are very fortunate to have five new faces for you to gaze upon; Maxine Harrington as Lady Capulet, David Bainger as Friar Laurence, Lewis Bird as the County Paris, Josh Townsend as Benvolio and Mia Kenny in the double role of Petra and Balthazar. They are really showing their worth and despite the shenanigans on stage, off stage we are just one big happy family. This is also the first time on the Players' stage for our leading lady, Jaz Weyer-Brown as Juliet, but she will be known by some of the TYKES where she helps out.

So where have you seen the rest before? Well, Sam Chamberlain is back again as the male lead, Romeo. Sam played Salerio in the Players' production of The Merchant of Venice last year. Of course Angela Healy who plays Juliet's nurse, (which she does with a rather lovely rural lilt) needs no introduction as do Amy Burton-Smith as the taunting tomboy (tomgirl?) Mercutio and Stephen Andrews as the ill tempered, ready for a fight, Tybalt – I see trouble ahead with those two. Gordon Mellor, who plays Capulet, became known to us as the incompetent buffoon, General Melchett in Blackadder and Richard Weare, playing Montague and Friar John, appeared in Blackadder as Private Tipperwick and the dragon keeper in Aladdin.

Everyone is being pulled together very ably by director Nicole Davall and assistant director, Jon Miles both of whom have a long involvement with Shakespeare. Nicole has decided to do the play in modern dress to help make the characters more immediate and relatable, and to find a new way to make it fresh. She says audiences often have a lot of ideas about how to do Shakespeare 'properly', and surprisingly often that involves doing it in tights. She doesn't want to give them that because she doesn't want to let them get too comfortable

## "Demons" Review by Richard Ford

Last night I went to see this powerful and moving play, superbly performed by the Teignmouth Touring Theatre Company at the Ice Factory in Teignmouth.

It was an exceptional piece of theatre that spoke directly to the emotions. Rebekah Hayden was extraordinary in the lead role, portraying Hannah, a grieving mother wrestling with a turbulent maelstrom of feelings, following the tragic death of her young son. Her ability to switch between contrasting extremes of emotion was breath-taking! Through her lifelike rendition of this tormented character, she took us with her on a roller coaster ride through grief, anger, bitterness and betrayal, to some kind of redemption and, ultimately, peace. It was a tour de force of character acting, sparklingly demonstrating the skills of this highly talented performer.

The entire cast were excellent. David Warren, as Jamie, sensitively painted the character of Hannah's rather too devoted friend. The delicate touch he brought to the role allowed their interactions to be both poignant and charming, providing warmth and some light relief from the intensity of the action.

Gary Freemantle, as Leo, ably demonstrated the very different way that the bereaved father handles (or doesn't handle) his grief. The moment when he finally revealed the dark secret he'd been carrying was especially moving.

The therapist, Carla, was convincingly and compassionately played by Jackie Wesley-Harkcom. She fearlessly and skilfully jousted with Hannah's inner demons, goading them out into the light through her incisive questioning. Jackie's calm assurance in the role marks a triumphant return to the stage after many years of directing.

Phil Wesley-Harkcom's portrait of the imprisoned driver was masterly. He captured the resigned realism of the character perfectly. His reluctant revealing of his own back story made the transformation of monster into man undeniable, bringing a humble nobility to the role.

That Phil also directed the play is testament to his multi-faceted talent. Exploiting the almost claustrophobic intimacy of the Ice Factory to full advantage, he created a dynamic, three dimensional production with which we had no choice but to fully engage. He conducted the ensemble cast skilfully, drawing out true-to-life performances and vivid interactions. He managed the cut and thrust of the many lightning fast scene changes, brilliantly.

The play itself is a wonderful piece of writing. Richard Everett has crafted a fascinating study of loss, blame and the power of forgiveness. Through Hannah's interaction with Carla, he catalyses the peeling away of defensive layers of fury, denial and blame. As the drama unfolds, each of the characters' inner turmoil is revealed. We, the audience, correspondingly experience a peeling away of the layers of our perception, revealing and causing us to question our readiness to judge people on the grounds of limited information. Each revelation pulls a bit more of the carpet out from under our feet until, at the end, like Hannah, we are left kneeling, contemplating our motivation and wondering whether we could ever forgive the perpetrators of our worst fears. The radiant smile that dawns on her face tells us that it has to be worth the attempt.

We very much appreciate the work put in by members of TP in providing us with a charming and extremely helpful front of house team who made it their business to make us, a visiting theatre company, so welcome and comfortable in your delightful studio theatre.

Our play, Demons, with your invaluable help, was very successful. The playwright, Richard Everett, has valued now the opportunity of seeing, for the first time, two of his plays that we have performed and presented at the Ice Factory – 'Something to Say' being a world premiere and 'Demons' a UK premier, neither of which he has actually seen performed anywhere before. Richard is remarkably fond of the venue and thinks it an ideal showcase for 'experimental and/or unusual' productions, something which would normally be the preserve of small professional organisations in the South-East.

We are delighted that The Ice Factory now figures in a Samuel French script announcing the venue as the location of its first production.

# WOULD YOU CONSIDER CHAPERONE TRAINING WITH TEIGNMOUTH PLAYERS?

Following the highly successful pantomime Aladdin we would like to add another thank you to those members who volunteered to chaperone the 17 young people involved with the show. They are behind the scenes at all times and are responsible for the safekeeping of our younger members up to the age of 16. We have arranged and paid for several of our members to attend the course run in Exeter on behalf of Devon County Council, which takes about 3 hours late afternoon by prior arrangement. The course incorporates an enhanced DBS check - Disclosure and Barring Service - which replaces the CRB checks, and when the course is passed they are provided with a Licence and updated information booklet.

In practice, there needs to be a minimum of two chaperone for every 12 young people but, as with the panto, there are times when more are needed as not all of the performers are on stage at the same time, and sometimes have to change costumes. At the moment all our volunteers are female so ideally it would be great if any of our male members would also consider taking this course. We would need assurance that you would be able to assist at future events run by Teignmouth Players but the chaperone licence can also be used to assist other local theatrical societies who need additional trained chaperones.
