### **Acclaim for Aladdin**

It's pantomime time again and Teignmouth Players have certainly done the company and the town proud. Their production of the traditional Arabian Nights story "Aladdin" skilfully directed by Amy Burton Smith and with Musical Director Jef Hocking, the superb line -up of Principals and supporting cast bring this ancient tale to life.

The most dramatic role is that of "Abanazer" the villainous fake uncle of the piece and David Warren scarily brought this character to life without turning into melodrama. His revolve when they returned from Egypt to China was excellently choreographed.

Howie Watkins certainly made Widow Twankey his own interpretation and delivered his "cracker" jokes with wonderful comic timing and much audience participation.

In the title role, Sophie Chamberlain certainly proved she was most peoples idea of a thigh slapping proincipal boy and could she sing - well matched with Sophie was vivacious Amy Whittaker as Princess Mandarin with a vocal range making their duets and solos a delight to behold.

In the two "Spirit" roles, Lisa Fletcher certainly made her Spirit of the Ring a feisty character and what a voice! Nathan Swain-Sachs' Genie of the Lamp was a colourful character study with a super number to his credit.

What a comedy trio. Cameron Dishart as Wishee Washee was popular with the children in the audience as were Karen Allen's Yu Dun Pong and Gavin Smith's Hu Dun Wong all their comedy policemen routines were laughingly received.

What an asset Angela Mayo-Carroll is to any show. In this pantomime she portrayed So Shy, the true and loyal handmaiden to the princess. David Renwick made a fine aristocratic Emperor.

The remainder of the eager cast performed throughout with tremendous energy especially the children's chorus who were a delight to watch on every entrance and I liked the trio of multi-colourful backing group.

### A Rehearsed Reading

On the last Saturday before Christmas what do you do? Chill out in front of the TV? Go to a party? Go down the Pub? Well, after all the rushing around and trying to calculate the cost so far, if the Turkey is big enough and will you be able to live on it until the end of the year? Phil and I went to The Ice Factory to see a 'Rehearsed Reading' – a take on the ancient story of Theseus - an inspired, original script by Jef Pirie.

This was 'something different' from TP and sadly more people didn't get to see it. Jef had gathered a very strong cast, then, after two rehearsals, he gave us a terrific show well worthy of attention. Jef said, when we complimented him on the strength of his team that it needed actors of such calibre to be able to present a play worth watching with minimal preparation.

Working only 'to blacks' with chairs for each participant we were treated to some brilliant characterization from David Warren, Rebekah Hayden, Andrew Malcolm, Hannah Baxter-Freeman, Lorraine and Ian Fergusson, Steve Andrews, Carrie Mcrae and Jef. Each actor portrayed a major character and then, as they say on the BBC, the minor parts were performed by the cast.

This was a worthwhile experiment and a genre that we should cultivate as more people would be able to take part and present polished 'shows' with little effort - - it could be a social evening once a month? Maybe a vehicle for local writers to exhibit their work.


